
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SUBJECT: RII Implementation Phase Round One Awards

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BACKGROUND

The RII implementation Phase includes \$125 million in funding over two rounds to fund interconnected projects that advance "Accelerate" or "Bet" sectors.



AWARDED CLUSTERS

The Council Co-Chairs confirmed \$80 million in funding for four proposed clusters, each focused on a different sector: life sciences, aerospace and defense, agtech and farm equipment, and bioeconomy. Together, these projects anticipate creating more than 23,000 direct and indirect jobs across 18 counties, in seven of the 13 economic regions (Redwood Coast, North State, North San Joaquin Valley, Central San Joaquin Valley, Central Coast, Los Angeles County, and Southern Border).

Larta Institute – \$3,300,000 (Ecosystem Support)

 Expand an existing business accelerator and provide financial assistance to small startups via a revolving loan fund.

LA DEO - \$19,000,000 (Infrastructure)

 Develop a revolving loan fund to support startups (particularly those coming out of the Larta Institute's accelerator) in constructing and expanding to graduated lab space in LA County.

LAEDC - \$700,000 (Ecosystem Support)

 Develop a business attraction and marketing campaign to attract large life science employers into the region (business attraction efforts limited to businesses outside of California).

 Support the utilization of agtech among small farmers, including more sustainable irrigation equipment and fenceless cattle grazing.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

Individual projects, and the clusters overall, were evaluated based on the applicant's comprehensive vision, their strategy to promote industry growth, alignment with the State Economic Blueprint, and the ability to leverage outside capital. In addition, the California Jobs First Council Co-Chairs considered whether each of the individual projects within the clusters were additive to each other or if they were standalone efforts, the physical location and proposed regional impact of the projects to ensure geographic equity, and the feasibility of the projects to promote job creation, attraction, and access.
